

Progress to date...

- Increased the number of assessment teams from 4 to 6. Increased itinerant school psychologists by 1; 2 now serve our Head Starts and Preschool Language Groups (PLG's) for students requiring comprehensive assessments
- Added an interpreter to support assessment teams
- Created a more efficient intake and assessment process. It currently takes one day from intake to assessment team, from 2 to 3 weeks
- Planning a unified curriculum throughout the ECSE program
- Offering more opportunities for professional development
- Formulating a more comprehensive evaluation process to improve the validity and accuracy of eligibility decisions for culturally and linguistically diverse students
- Providing Preschool Informational Clinics twice a month, including Saturdays
- Planning a parent support group. To begin on November 18 @ 9:30 @ Ballard Center. The groups will meet every third Tuesday of the month
- Planning bilingual parent workshop to encourage literacy development
