
Ethnic Studies Board Update 2019

Accomplishments: Multi-year Plan

- ✓ Presented to Capacity Builders (May 2018)
- ✓ Provided Introduction to Ethnic Studies professional development (August 2018)
- ✓ Developed new course Identity & Agency in US History (UC approved August 15, 2018)
- ✓ Added Hoover to schools offering Introduction to Ethnic Studies



Goals in Progress: Multi-year Plan

- Professional development for US history
 - > 38 teachers, 26 high schools and middle schools
- New course and unit development
 - Identity & Agency in US History (Honors)
 - Identity & Agency in American Literature
 - 8th grade units in US history
 - 8th grade units on representations in media and film

Local and State Growth

- 5 new members added to Ethnic Studies Advisory
- ► 36 SDUSD teachers participated in California National Association for Multicultural Education
- Dr. Gomez, teacher at Lincoln High School and co-chair of Ethnic Studies Advisory Committee, invited to write model Ethnic Studies Curriculum for the state
- ▶ 15 districts in California have made Ethnic Studies a graduation requirement (ethnicstudiesnow.com)
- ► AB331 Ethnic Studies



- Continue to incorporate a variety of assignments and activities.

Recommendations

- 1. Continue development of new courses and units.
- 2. Offer professional development for foundations of ethnic studies (5 days) and new world history course (5 days).
- 3. Offer site-based professional development to provide ongoing support for ethnic studies.
- 4. Embed ethnic studies content and pedagogy into courses as new courses and lessons are being developed.
- 5. Continue collaboration with Ethnic Studies Advisory Committee to make revisions to the multi-year plan.
